## **ADDENDUM NO. 1**

Request for Quotation (RFQ) 23-3003816 Video Surveillance System Inspection Services, is hereby amended as follows:

## **Responses to Questions:**

1. Question: Are the re-inspection fees billable costs?

Answer: Yes, however a permit is required if a passing sign-off is contingent on

equipment installation or any work expenses exceeding \$3,000. DeKalb

County's electrical inspectors will then manage all subsequent

inspections.

2. Question: How long is the payout from the County after completing the reports and

sending it to the county for payment?

Answer: DeKalb County's policy requires a net 30-day payment period following

the receipt of an invoice for an open purchase order.

3. Question: How many cameras per range of 273 businesses are we installing?

Or is it 273 different businesses?

Answer: Equipment installation is not necessary for the completion of this work;

inspections & certification compliance are the only requirements. There are a minimum of 273 businesses subject to inspections and certification

compliance.

4. Question: If separate buildings, how many cameras are in each building?

Answer: The number of cameras will vary from one business to the next

(convenience stores & gas stations).

5. Question: Are the cameras mounted to a bracket or pole?

Answer: The mounting method for the cameras will vary. Only the inspection of

camera placement, minimum technological standards, and storage capacity

are required.

6. Question: If there are no walk-throughs, can you provide plans for the buildings so

we can inspect where the cameras need to be placed?

Answer: Majority of the businesses requiring inspections have camera equipment

in place. The contractor will certify if the equipment meets the standards

outlined in the ordinance.

7. Question: What are the penalties for non-compliance with the video surveillance

ordinance?

Answer: The enforcement and penalties are regulated by DeKalb County Code

Officers and Inspectors. See section 8. (L) of the Ordinance.

8. Question: How are businesses affected that open after the June 30<sup>th</sup> effective date?

	Answer:	Businesses opening after the effective date will be required to submit a low voltage VSS plan in their construction documents to receive a Certificate of Occupancy during their final inspection.
9.	Question:	How long will businesses get to comply with the June 30 <sup>th</sup> effective date?
	Answer:	Each business will have 60 days after the initial inspection to comply with the ordinance.
10.	Question:	Are you sourcing only one contractor for this contract?
	Answer:	Yes, but the contractor can have multiple technicians.
11.	Question:	Is special consideration being given to minority owned/women owned businesses in the awarding of this contract?
	Answer:	Special consideration will not be given to minority owned/women owned businesses for this project.
12.	Question:	Can the awarded contractor offer the training session required in the contract at a contractor's office?
	Answer:	Yes, training sessions can be provided at the contractor's office, provided it is a secure and compliant space according to building code.
13.	Question:	Will site visits to affected businesses be scheduled, or unannounced?
	Answer:	We will try to schedule all site visits but reserve the right to inspect at a reasonable time. Ideally, the owner/operator or decision-maker will be present at the time of the inspection.
14.	Question:	What information will the awarded contractor be given regarding the affected businesses? (Example; List of businesses/contact information)
	Answer:	Information provided for the businesses include a list of the businesses, account numbers, addresses/locations, and, if available, business names.
15.	Question:	Will the compliance officer(s) accompany the awarded contractor to the individual site visits?

Answer: Yes, unless alternative arrangements are made and confirmed by all

parties, the compliance officer is expected to be present on-site during the

inspection.

16. Question: Can you provide further clarification on the requirements for inspection

and training across the 273 buildings within the County?

Answer: Inspections involve on-site visits and assessment of equipment and

standards, completed with, and observed by one or more compliance officers. The training is expected to be instructional and hands-on, taking

place in either a classroom or in the field.

17. Question: Please provide insight into the historical average range for successful bids

in projects of this nature

Answer: This is the first solicitation of its kind in DeKalb County; however, the

County does not anticipate exceeding \$50K for these services.

18. Question: How many qty of cameras do you need?

Answer: The number of cameras requiring inspection will differ for each business.

You may be asked to provide professional recommendations.
