"DeKalb Makes Recycling Simple" event highlights partnership

DECATUR, Ga. – The DeKalb County Sanitation Division, in collaboration with the DeKalb County School District, hosted a "DeKalb Makes Recycling Simple" event on April 15, 2015. The event highlighted the intergovernmental agreement and partnership between the County and school district. The agreement provides for the services of recycling collection and disposal and heightened recycling education to the school district's facilities and schools.

"This partnership helps divert tons of trash from DeKalb's Seminole Road Landfill and keeps us a healthier and sustainable DeKalb," said DeKalb Interim CEO Lee May. "We currently have 50 schools signed on, and we hope to have all 139 DeKalb County Schools on board by the end of the year."
