DeKalb Celebrates Earth Day with Unveiling of Four Electric Vehicle Charging Stations Available to Public

DECATUR, Ga. – DeKalb County hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony and live demonstration on **Thursday, April 23** to unveil one of the four electric car charging stations now available to the public at the Sanitation Division's Central Transfer Station.

"We're proud that DeKalb plays a leading role in Atlanta's ranking as second in the nation for electric car ownership, and excited our residents can take part in our sustainability efforts and reduced emissions by using these stations," said DeKalb County Interim CEO Lee May.

Partial funding for the installation of three of the charging stations is provided through the Georgia Environmental Finance Authority's (GEFA) <u>"Charge Georgia"</u> program, which allows for a 50 percent reimbursement of costs for the installation of electric car charging stations throughout the County.

The total cost of these stations is \$37,494 and the amount reimbursed to the County for construction is \$17,982. The other station, donated by Capital City Nissan in Chamblee, GA, is located at the DeKalb-Peachtree Airport. Plans to build a fifth County station at Seminole Road Landfill are underway, and construction should be complete within 60 days.

Dedicated alternating current (AC) Level II and direct current quick charging (DCQC) electric vehicle (EV) charging stations and associated parking stations are available for public use for any battery electric, plug-in hybrid and extended-range vehicles.
