

Shoal Creek Trunk Sewer Improvement Project Section I

Fact Sheet

What is the Project?

The Shoal Creek Trunk Sewer Section I is a critical component of DeKalb County's sewer collection infrastructure and conveys sewerage from local residents, businesses, and industries to the Snapfinger Creek Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility (AWTF). The project is a part of the county's \$4.27 billion capital improvement plan to improve its water and wastewater infrastructure. Once completed, the Shoal Creek Trunk Sewer Improvement Project Section I will provide much needed capacity to accommodate future growth and enhance the environmental resilience of the County's infrastructure.

This section begins at the Snapfinger Creek AWTF and extends northwest through DeKalb County up to Flat Shoal Parkway and Boring Road. The primary components include:

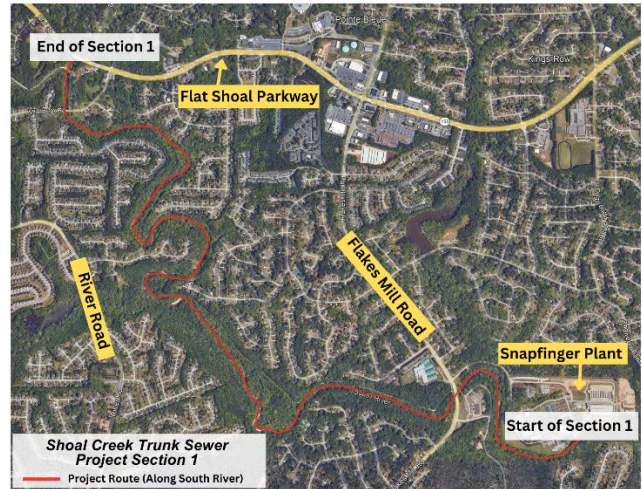
- Replacing and/or upgrading of approximately 3.7 miles of sewer pipeline.
- Crossing numerous existing residents and businesses.
- Removing aged infrastructure from adjacent stream banks.

The entire project is divided into three sections:

- Section 1: Snapfinger Creek AWTF to Flat Shoals Parkway
- Section 2: Flat Shoal Parkway to Interstate 20
- Section 3: Interstate 20 to South Columbia Drive

The commissioner district 3 and super district 7 covers Section I.

Where is the Project?



Things You Need to Know

DeKalb County owns and operates an expansive wastewater collection and transmission system. This system consists of 2,650 miles of sewer, 62 lift stations, 61,500 manholes, and two AWTFs – all of which serve approximately 620,000 DeKalb County residents. The county is divided into three sewer basins – Intergovernmental Basin, Snapfinger Basin, and Pole Bridge Basin – which consist of 35 sewer sheds. The County only provides wastewater treatment in the Snapfinger and Pole Bridge Basins, which contain the Snapfinger and Pole Bridge AWTFs, respectively.

The County's wastewater collection system has experienced significant Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs) over the past several years. The SSOs are a result of infiltration and inflow of non-wastewater into the system, primarily caused by poor pipe conditions. As a result, DeKalb County entered a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) on December 20, 2011 (Civil Action File No. 1:10-CV-4039- SDG), to address deficiencies. The Consent Decree was later amended on September 9, 2021 to reflect additional discoveries and subsequent schedule modifications necessary to return the system to compliance.

The Shoal Creek Trunk Sewer Improvement Project Section I has been identified by the County as an important Capital Improvement Project to foster Consent Decree compliance as well as provide additional conveyance capacity to the Snapfinger AWTF.

What's the Project's Status?

DeKalb County's Department of Watershed Management awarded the construction company, JDS Inc., early 2026. Construction will begin Spring 2026 and will last approximately 3½ years.

What's Next?

- Construction Begins Spring 2026
- Substantial Completion Fall 2029
