Finance Report- Robert Ingram

- Finance Report as of March 15, 2024, was presented to the Board. (*Page 9*)
- Special recognition was provided to the Youth, Adult, and Quest Team for their great job with bringing in participants.
- 2022 and FY 2023 funds are expended
- PY24 Youth and Adult funds are in progress:
 - o \$990,000: Youth
 - o \$813,000: Adult
 - o Dislocated Worker Funds: Not received yet
- PY 22-PY 23 funds were decreased by 4%

Q&A Part 1

- Ouestion 1- Erica-Antoinette Slaton: Has WSD researched the RFP regarding utilizing funds during the year that are required?
- O Answer- Robert Davis: There are 18 WorkSource Areas, 3 provide direct services. WorkSource DeKalb offered hybrid services after the pandemic. Youth RFP is going well, except for Adult and Dislocated Worker. WorkSource DeKalb and In the Door are working well together. WSD is mandated by the county regarding how the RFP process is handled. With the excellent staff and offering direct services, WorkSource DeKalb services are better than having a RFP. The RFP process is extensive and takes up to 6 months for completion. Hiring new staff can take up to 6 weeks. WSD staff is a better option than applying for the RFP due to the processing timeframe.
- o Question 2-Erica-Antoinette Slaton: How is the timeframe reconciled?
- Answer- Robert Davis: Funds are reviewed in advance to determine the process for hiring new staff; everything must balance out. TCSG monitors how much money is used.

State Policy Update- Robert Davis

- State Board Meeting was held February 2024.

V. Updates

WIOA Programs (Adult & Dislocated Workers)- Sabrina Lee

- WorkSource DeKalb Staff are still working onsite every Wednesday at Georgia Piedmont Technical College to provide outreach services to students.
- During the GPTC Spring Career Fair, WorkSource DeKalb staff distributed information on services provided and created connections with people.
- There has been a large increase in caseloads with assistance from program partners such as In the Door. In The Door and Georgia Piedmont Technical College contribute to the success of WorkSource DeKalb.
- The focus is employment and increasing credentials. Mr. Robert Davis spoke with the training providers to remind them of the importance of students earning credentials.
- It is the Training Providers job to encourage students to earn their credential. Two providers shared that the efforts of WSD helped with students receiving their credentials.
- Credentials also help with exiting participants.

• WorkSource DeKalb Success Story Video Was Presented to The Board:

- WIOA program participant Courtney Roberson received her CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) certification.
- Ms. Roberson completed her training during Summer 2023, and she is now state certified.
- o Assistance with uniforms and transportation were also provided to Ms. Roberson.
- Courtney Roberson is currently enrolled in school preparing to become a RN. (Registered Nurse)

Suggestions

- Hank Stewart: Mr. Stewart suggested the success story video be shared with DeKalb School System and technical schools. Courtney Roberson should serve as spokesperson for WorkSource DeKalb.
- o <u>Erica-Antoinette Slaton:</u> Special recognition was provided to Donnie and the marketing team.
- <u>Erica-Antoinette Slaton and Denise Townsend:</u> It was suggested that Ms. Roberson participate in showcases and have her success story displayed onsite at Georgia Piedmont Technical College. Perhaps stipends can be provided to Ms. Roberson.





WIOA Youth Program- Jowan Dennis

- Success story: One participant completed the Goodwill Welding Certification program and is currently employed.
- Kaiser Bridge Program was discussed. The Kaiser Bridge Program provides full coverage health insurance with free premiums to WIOA program participants. Kaiser staff are available to come to the office to offer services. Presentation was provided to WorkSource staff recently and flyers are provided at the front desk.

• Q&A- Part 2

- Question 1- Vanessa Gibson: Is it possible to reach out and serve at risk youth during the outreach events?
- Answer- Jowan Dennis: Yes. WorkSource DeKalb will not discriminate on which participants to serve. Ms. Dennis served as Guest Speaker during the GOALS program graduation.
- WorkSource DeKalb has a re-entry program, which is in progress and a language interpreter line for customers.
- WSD Business Solutions Unit helps create connections with employers and various companies.

• STRIDE Program

- This program is a WorkSource DeKalb partnership with the court system to provide services to first time offenders. Participants are required to attend various workshops.
- WSD Outreach Specialist Margo Hall, helps maintain the connections with the program.
- One of the Youth Program's clients had issues at his workplace and will be starting program soon.





• Suggestions/Additional Comments

- Hank Stewart-WorkSource DeKalb should consider appearing on radio stations for national exposure, monthly radio presence.
- o <u>Jowan Dennis-</u>Ms. Dennis expressed that WorkSource DeKalb has a Facebook and Instagram social media page.
- Erica-Antoinette Slaton:
 - WSD is doing a great job with outreach.
 - Numbers need to be provided to show the progress and see the impact.
 - Mr. Pittman provides numbers and performance (Jowan Dennis)
 - WSDs efficiency needs to improve, sending text messages to youth clients and figuring out what methods work best will help with improvement.
- O Hank Stewart- WSD staff need to figure out how to better communicate with participants by asking the summer youth their preferred method of contact. Get youth more engaged. Special commendation was offered to Ms. Jowan Dennis. GOALS program participants can have their records sealed once they complete the program.
- o <u>Erica-Antoinette Slaton-</u> The Towers High School Career Fair was a success.
 - Commendation was provided to Mr. Hank Stewart and his foundation.
 - Project Pinnacle is a great resource for WorkSource DeKalb to use to help increase numbers; Partnering with programs with regulations such as the court system is a great way to start.
- Jowan Dennis- It was explained that \$250 incentives are provided to Youth Program participants for reaching their goals by earning their GED, High School, Diploma, or completing the summer program.
 - Ms. Anaya Lemons (Workforce Assistant); Makes phone calls to youth after hours since most youth are in school during the daytime.
- Hank Stewart- It was suggested that a list of the High School students not eligible to graduate be provided to WSD staff, to begin providing services.

QUEST Grant- Bria Peterson

- QUEST (Quality Jobs Equity Strategy and Training Grant)
- QUEST Grant was made available for use September 2023
- The grant Is scheduled to end September 2025.
- Quest Partnerships:
 - Clarkston Community Center (CCC)
 - o DeKalb Community Supervision (DCS)
 - Sheriff Department of DeKalb County (DKSO)
 - Metro Re-entry Correction Facility (MRCF)
- Quest grant is available for returning citizens.
- Construction Ready program serves incarcerated individuals:
 - o 9 credentials are earned through the program
 - o 18 participants are currently enrolled (03/11/24-04/04/2024)
- DCS Partnership currently has 52 returning citizens or justice impacted referrals.
 - o 6 participants are on Ms. Peterson's caseload
 - o 5 participants have started the "Starting Your WIOA Process"





- QUEST grant was extended to 2025
 - o Metro Re-entry Construction Ready will have 2 cohorts and extend to 4 total.
- The computer lab at WorkSource DeKalb will be used for Metro Re-entry, DeKalb Sheriff Department, and DCS referrals to complete their applications.
- The DeKalb Re-entry Collaborative Summit will be available for participants and held April 13, 2024 (10am- 2pm)
- Kaiser Bridge program will be available for participants to use.

• Participant Success Story- Bria Peterson

- o Program participant Andrea Simpson completed her CDL program with Roadmaster Truck Driving School on March 5, 2024. Video and interview will be forthcoming.
- 74 participants are currently enrolled in the QUEST grant program.
- April 5, 2024 is the last day of class for the Metro Re-entry program cohorts; New program will start during the end of April with 20 participants enrolled.

• Q&A- Part 3

- Ouestion 1- Erica-Antoinette Slaton: Is there additional support needed for WorkSource DeKalb with the Sheriff Department partnership?
- Answer- Bria Peterson: No, several meetings have already been held with Mr. Eric Moore.
- Additional Comments- Erica-Antoinette Slaton: Ms. Slaton expressed her interest in assisting WSD; she has connections with the Sheriff Department and wants to attend any future meetings.

Performance Report PY 23-Q2- Gregory Pittman

- Performance Report was shared with the Board.
- Due to increase WSD staff effort and increase in enrollment, WSD is near the performance goals. Numbers have increased since the previous WSD Board Meeting.
- Numbers for Quarter 2 and Quarter 4 have increased for Youth, Adult, and Dislocated Worker.
- Credential numbers are currently 64; 44 more are needed.
- Measurable Skills Gain: Youth Department is working on updating the Youth participant High School Diplomas in the system.
- As more participants are being serviced, there will continue to be an increase in numbers.
- <u>Commendation- Erica-Antoinette Slaton:</u> Commendation was provided to WSD staff for their flexibility and being open to receiving suggestions from the WSD Board.

• Outreach Events- Brittany McClure

- Outreach Events report from January 24- March 24, 2024, was presented to the Board,
- o 28 Outreach Events were held per district
- o WSD will continue to highlight partnerships and increase success.
- Additional Comments- Robert Davis:
 - PY 22: July 1st- June 30th, 2023: 180 new participants were enrolled
 - PY 23: 292 participants were brought in as of March
 - WorkSource DeKalb staff was commended for their great work.

One Stop Operator Report- Robert Gordon

- DeKalb Unemployment Rate: 3.1%
- There has been an increase in Dislocated Worker enrollment.
- March enrollment numbers have increased; many youth referrals were made.
- Georgia Department of Labor had a split in funding; Wagner Peyser transitioned to TCSG (Technical College System of Georgia). Additional staff will be hired to assist with resume writing and interviewing workshops.
- There is also an influx of customers with language barriers and disabilities. WSD staff training will be scheduled soon.
- Unemployment data as of January 2024 was shared with the Board.
- In The Door aspires to partner with WorkSource DeKalb Youth Department to host a Career Fair for High School Graduates.
- The Legacy Harvest Foundation is providing a scholarship for graduating seniors. This serves as an additional resource for non-eligible WIOA participants.
- In The Door One-Stop Navigator Sydney Howard graduated from Georgia State University with a Science degree. She will be leaving In The Door and WSD to start a new career as a forensic scientist on April 16, 2024. Ms. Howard is very efficient and will be missed by her co-workers. She assisted with numerous outreach events and provided fast and efficient service to customers.





DeKalb Virtual Career Academy 2024- Robert Davis

- Dates for the 2024 DeKalb Virtual Career Academy are not confirmed; The program usually starts one week after school ends.
- The goal is to hire 700 youth
- Ages 14-24
- The program will be virtual
- Youth who are not selected can possibly enroll in the WIOA program.
