DeKalb County Boil Water Advisory Remains in Place

DECATUR, Ga.— The DeKalb County Department of Watershed Management's Boil Water Advisory is still in effect for the following areas:

- East of Moreland Ave.
- West of Candler St. and Clairemont Ave.
- South of Mason Mill
- North of Hosea Williams Dr.

DeKalb residents who receive their water from the City of Atlanta are not affected by the boil water advisory.

The boil water advisory will remain in place until the DeKalb County Department of Watershed Management is cleared to lift the Advisory following water sampling protocols by the Georgia Environmental Protection Division and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
