2025 DeKalb County Legislative Agenda

The philosophy of the 2025 State Legislative Agenda is to establish a flexible process for the Board of Commissioners to maximize priority approval and/or progression at the State level and to encourage greater collaboration between Commissioners and the DeKalb State Delegation. Staff has developed the following policy spheres for this year's legislative agenda: Economic Development, Elections, Environmental Reform & Sustainability, Housing, Public Health, Public Safety, Transportation, and Other. (Items highlighted in yellow are newly proposed legislative items)

Economic Development

DeKalb County supports efforts that allow local governments more tools to affect positive change in the development of its local market and provide more opportunities of prosperity for its citizens while safeguarding its infrastructure.

Priorities

- DeKalb County requests the General Assembly to address annexation and de-annexation processes within the State of Georgia. DeKalb County has material issues with several specific aspects of the current laws.
 - a. Repeal O.C.G.A. Section 36-31-11.1(f) regarding the sale of parks. (Sponsor: Commissioner Robert Patrick, District 1)
 - b. Supports a comprehensive review of the 60% annexation method. (Sponsors: Commissioner Robert Patrick, District 1; Commissioner Michelle Long Spears, District 2; Commissioner Ted Terry, Super District 6)
 - c. Supports legislation on the removal of barriers to the de-annexation process in Georgia. (Sponsor: Commissioner Michelle Long Spears, District 2)
 - d. Opposes any legislative annexation advanced to the delegation. (Sponsor: Commissioner Ted Terry, Super District 6)
- Supports the creation of a Warehouse Worker Protection Act.

- Requests the General Assembly provide parity between Counties and Cities regarding the authority to adopt ordinances to regulate the possession of less than one ounce of marijuana.

- Requests the General Assembly repeal O.C.G.A. Section 30-60-32 regarding the preemption of video surveillance at gas stations.
