TT: Do we have the capacity to amend this contract or add an additional vendor specifically for cardboard collections in the future?

We are not currently taking cardboard separate and we could increase revenue based on the audit.

Does it make sense to take the cardboard directly to the vendor separately?

TH: It would require more capital from the department to hire more drivers and acquire more trucks to accomplish hauling cardboard separately to the vendor. The process in place now returns quite a bit of revenue to the County, we receive an offset on our bill that saves money monthly.

The current process works for us, if we were to add another vendor we would lose the ability to control when they run their routes and how they run their routes, it would take control away from the County.

TT: Understood, I am looking for the best use of resources. If we can generate more revenue with direct cardboard sorting, then we should explore those options.

TH: We can review adding additional trucks in the long term.

TT: *It seems that September is a low month, is there a reason for that?*

TH: Yes, sometimes it can sit on the floor, sometimes the vendor has issues bringing it in. The recent chemical fire has shut the vendor down completely. So we will generally see an increase in the next month.

TT: The audit report spoke to a 45% contamination rate.

TH: The average contamination rate is 31%.

TT: Can we look at ways to educate or encourage compliance with the residents?

TH: Yes

TT: Is there a process where drivers can look to see if the trash is compliant and not take it if it is noncompliant? TH: We do have our door hangers, but we would love to work to ensure compliance.
